ORDINANCES GOVERNING

LL.B. (HONS.) IN BHARATIYA JURISPRUDENCE

Three Years (Six Semester) Degree Programme

Under the powers conferred by Sections 6(1) (iv) & 29 (1) (b) of the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020 read with Clauses 28 & 39 of its First Statute, the University hereby approves the Six-Semester Programme of the LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Degree Programme and adopts this ordinance governing admission, courses of study, examination and other matters relating to LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Three Years Degree Programmeunder the Department of VidhishastraVidyashakha, Central Sanskrit University.

1. Preamble

WHEREAS, with the approval of the University and as per the recommendations of the Board of Studies, Vidhishastra Vidyashakhais committed to provide quality education by adopting innovative study methods & course curriculum in LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence;

AND WHEREAS, it is expedient to orient towards Bharatiya Legal Education by making provisions for instruction in new courses of study, extensive as well as intensive manner of prescribed courses and also for adequate practical training for diverse careers open to Law Graduates;

AND WHEREAS, with a view to develop Tradition based legal education and to provide sufficient opportunity for specialization in Bharatiya Jurisprudence and selected field of study in Law. The VidhishastraVidyashakhaaffirms to introduce the LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Three Years, Six Semester Degree Programme.

2. Objectives

The Central Sanskrit University has the unique distinction of being the largest and the only multi- language campus university in the world. The Central Sanskrit University also has the privilege of acting as the nodal agency for the implementation of Sanskrit related policies & schemes of the Government of India. In order to promote Sanskrit language and Dharmashastrik Tradition in the field of Legal Education the university has decided to introduce LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence.

- 2.2 The Three-Year LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence strives to promote Bharatiya knowledge-based system in the field of Legal Education to establish foundations of *Dharmashastra* in law and practice.
- The Programme has a vivid objective of working for the revival of the Bharatiya 2.3 raditions-based knowledge of Law and Legal Principles.
- 2.4 The Programme envisions to establish BharatiyaJurisprudence as a vibrant field of multi-disciplinary area to be explored in the field of law.
- The Programme fosters the transformation of Legal Education by providing a new horizon of Bharatiya tradition vis a vis the approach to Legal Education.
- The Programme fundamentally focuses to fill the gap between existing status 2.6 and the desired destination of legal education by incorporating principles of Dharma and Dharmashastric traditions of Law.
- The Goal of the Programme is to make aware the common people about the 2.7 fundamental concept of 'Duty' and its significance to reinstate the traditionbased values and ethics.
- The Course curriculum is imperative for realigning Bharatiya Legal System 2.8 with its intrinsic values, promoting justice and restoring public trust in institutions and processes.
- The LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence comprises of mandatory and 2.9 optional papers designed with specific objectives of connecting law in books to law in practice. It enables students to acquire critical legal thinking and skills and empowers students to apply legal knowledge and skills to real-life legal issues and problems in the context of social, economic, political, and cultural dynamics of the sustainable contemporary world.
- 2.10 The Programme promotes the study of the Shastras and Sanskrit literature with unique pedagogical approach to preserve Bharatiyavalues, traditions and jurisprudence.
- 2.11 The Programme promotes to build up the character in youth by the principles of Dharma and ethics as an integral part of Legal Education.
- 2.12 We affirm that the Rule of Dharma (Law) based legal education shall carve out the personality and character to the fullest extent. Tradition-based Legal Education should produce men adept in tailoring traditional legal prescriptions to the needs of present-day Bharat and strive for the life excellence and Samarasata in the society.





3. STRUCTURE

- 3.1 **LL.B.** (Hons.) in *Bharatiya* Jurisprudence shall be awarded to candidates on successful completion of a Six-Semester Programme of study. The total intake of Students in the Programme shall be 60.
- 3.2 Admission, studies, examinations, and continuance from semester to semester, promotion and declaration of results for the LL.B. (Hons.) in *Bharatiya*Jurisprudence are given in the following ordinances.
- 3.3 LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence programme shall have courses of 216 credits in Six Semesters, as given below:

4. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A candidate shall be eligible for admission to LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Semester I, if he/she has passed the following:

Admission to 3- Year Six Semester LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence	B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./Shastri (at least 10+2+3 pattern) securing a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate (45% for SC, ST & OBC) considering all the subjects in the three years except those subjects where only pass marks are required and which do not contribute to the total in the final (Degree) Marksheet. OR any other Degree under at	
	least 10+2+3 pattern recognized by the Bar Council of India for the purpose of admission to LL.B. Course securing a minimum of 50%

marks in the aggregate (45% for SC, ST & OBC) considering all the subjects in the three years (aggregate being calculated as mentioned above). Preference shall be given for students having Studies -Dharmashastra, Nyaya, Mimansa, Public Administration and similar subjects. Other will also be encouraged.

5. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 5.1 Admission to LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Semester I programme of study shall be made on merit in the entrance test of the university/Common University Entrance Test i.e. CUET.
- 5.2 There shall be an admission Committee for LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence, constituted under the provisions of Ordinances. Admission shall be made in accordance with these ordinances and the rules made thereunder.
- 5.3 Admission cannot, however, be claimed by any candidate as a matter of right. The admission or re-admission of a candidate shall be entirely at the discretion of the Admission Committee which may refuse to admit any student without assigning any reason there of.
- 5.4 On his/her selection for admission to the LL.B. (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence Semester I programme, the candidate shall, within the fees prescribed for the programme. If the candidate fails to deposit fees within the stipulated time, his/her selection shall automatically stand cancelled. Such a candidate shall not be admitted to the concerned programme unless a fresh order of selection and extension of date for payment of fees is issued as per norms.
- 5.5 Admission of Foreign Nationals: Applications of foreign nationals nominated by the Government of India under scholarship schemes and self-financing Foreign Nationals shall be entertained for the aforesaid programme. They shall not be subject to the Entrance Test provided they have passed the equivalent qualifying examination and satisfy the minimum eligibility requirements.

Reservation to the extent of 15% of the quota of Programme in a subject, on supernumerary basis, for Foreign Nationals shall be made for admission to each of the various aforementioned Programme available in the Department.

The International Students Advisor of the university shall get examined the eligibility etc. of each applicant and shall issue the eligibility letter to the concerned foreign national, if found eligible.

6. RESERVATION/WEIGHTAGES

All the students across the country want to get admission in this University. The reservation policies for admission in Central Sanskrit University (CSU) are as follows:

6.1 Reservation

1. Scheduled Caste (SC)

15% of total intake in each course

2. Scheduled Tribe (ST)

 $7\frac{1}{2}$ % of total intake in each course

3. Other Backward Classes (OBC)

27% of total intake in each course


4. Economically Weaker Section (EWS)

10% other than total intake in each course

5. Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) quota = 3% of total intake (1% each for the persons with low vision or blindness, hearing impaired and locomotor disability or cerebral).

Children/Widows of the eligible Armed Forces Personnel reservation (CW Category) = 5% of the seats in each course.

Foreign Nationals

= 5% seats in each course in Departments/ Colleges for admission under reservation.

Note: In case of non-availability of reserved category candidates the seats will be filled up from the General Category candidates as per the directives of UGC/GOI.

- 6.2 Supernumerary seats for Employees: 10% supernumerary seats shall be reserved for the wards of permanent employees (including those on probation) of the University currently in service or were in service during the academic session immediately preceding the one (session) for which the Entrance Test is held, provided the candidate fulfils the minimum eligibility requirements and qualifies in the Entrance Test. CSU employees' ward 's category applicants shall be required to submit the certificate of the employee ward only in the prescribed format duly signed and issued by the Dy. Registrar (Administration) if called for admission.
- **6.3 Paid Seat Quota**: The Faculty may admit students under the supernumerary paid seat quota as per the norms fixed by the University from time to time and laid in the Information Bulletin for the concerned year of admission.
- **6.4 Sports Seat Quota:** Admission under sports Seats shall be done as per the University rules contained in the Information Bulletin of the concerned admission year.

7. ATTENDANCE

- 7.1 Regular attendance of all the classes is compulsory for the students.
- 7.2 The name of the student is liable to be struck off in case he absents himself from the classes continuously for ten days or more without applying, in writing, for leave of absence.
- 7.3 The Head of the Department (HoD) may order readmission of such student, provided, he is satisfied with the student's explanation of reasons for the unauthorized absence. In such case, the student shall have to deposit his admission charges afresh.
- 7.5 A student must have 75% attendance in order to be able to sit in the examination. *i.e.* a student will be allowed leave only for a maximum of 25 per cent of total lecture days in one academic semester.
- 7.6 A student's leave will be admissible only with prior permission of the HoD on following prescribed grounds
 - a) 10-days leave without medical certificate, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department.
 - b) 20-days medical leave for which a medical certificate of sickness and fitness has been obtained from a registered medical practitioner.
 - 7.7 There shall be an Attendance Monitoring Committee in the Faculty under the Chairmanship of the HoD.

Note: Appearing in two examinations at the same time, whether conducted by the CSU or any other educational institution, is not permitted.

9.2 Legal Research and Moot Court Fee:

- (i) The Legal Research and Moot Court Fee payable shall be Rs. 500/- for each semester and shall be paid along with the first and third installments of the tuition fee of the academic year concerned or beginning of the each semester as the case may be.
- (ii) The Legal Research and Moot Court Fee shall be credited to the "Legal Research and Moot Court Fund" of the Law School and shall be utilized for the purposes of preparation, purchase and supply of reading and writing materials, organisation of Moot Courts and materials needed therefor, imparting practical training to students, organising practical training lectures, organising various extension programmes and other related matters pertaining to practical training courses and for such other matters as may be conducive in the opinion of the HoD, in consultation with the Policy & Planning Committee of the Department and / or any other committee constituted by the HoD for the management of the Fund, for adequate study and training in law.

10. Scholarship

10.1 Objective -The main purpose of granting scholarship to the students of the CSU is to encourage the students to receive Sanskrit education.

10.2 Eligibility for Scholarship

(i) 100 percent scholarship (Rs.800/- per month) for just 10 months only for the students who have passed the CUET Entrance test or Entrance Test conducted by Campus with



- (ii) The scholarship shall be awarded on merit basis. The students, in whose favour the scholarship has been sanctioned in the first year of the course, shall continue to receive the same till the duration of the course, if they are declared pass every year and confinue to be eligible for scholarship. But, if they are declared promoted in any subject or paper, or are held up for Compartment, they shall not be considered for grant of scholarship for the rest of the years of the course.
- (iii) Eligible students from IInd year may also be considered for grant of scholarship, if some

Rules for grant of scholarship

- a. The grant of scholarship shall depend upon educational progress, good conduct and
- b. The scholarship shall be granted for 10 months in a year.
- c. Every year, or upon passing an examination, a fresh selection of students for the grant of scholarship shall be made. The students who have completed their syllabus, or have passed a part of the exam, shall be awarded scholarship in the New Year or course on
- d. A student getting scholarship on the basis of above rules shall not receive any scholarship, salary, fees etc. from any other source. If he/she is receiving such income, he/she shall have to leave that employment and return the money received. In case, he/she unexpectedly receives some prize, in cash or any other mode, equivalent to or less than the amount of his/her scholarship, he /she shall not be deemed unfit for receiving the scholarship. Similarly, he /she shall be allowed to avail of free education provided by the university, hostel facilities for self-study, books and travel facilities.
- e. The amount of scholarships may be increased or decreased by the CSU any time. The scholarships shall be disbursed only upon receipt of financial approval and the amount approved from the University. For receipt of the scholarship, 75% attendance and maintenance of discipline are a must.
- The scholarship may be suspended or cancelled, in case some teacher or employee of the CSU complains of indiscipline by the student. The selection process for scholarship the student must apply for scholarship in the prescribed form. After a scrutiny of the applications, the Director shall grant approval for award of scholarship, under rules, on the basis of the merit.
- g. Duration of scholarship
 - The duration of the scholarship shall be 10 months in a session. (i)
 - Depending upon the eligibility criteria, the scholarship shall be from the first or (ii) second year to the last year of the course.
 - The scholarship, once cancelled, shall not be resumed without the prior (iii) permission of the CSU.
 - (iv) Satisfactory conduct and regular attendance are the basic conditions of the scholarship. If the attendance of a student falls below 75% in any month, in







any subject, he shall not be given scholarship till the time he does not complete the mandatory 75% attendance. In case, a student remains continuously absent for 30 days, he shall be given scholarship only after deducting the amount due during the period of absence, even if the overall percentage of his attendance is above 75%.

(v) Student should open a bank account as per direction of concerned Campus.

Disbursement -

Normally, the Director of concerned campus shall order the disbursement of scholarship amount to the students' bank account in the first week of every month, on the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee which the committee shall make after taking into consideration the percentage of attendance by the student. The scholarship shall begin from the date the student actually starts attending the classes.

11. HOSTEL

Boys & Girls hostel facilities are available in the campuses of the CSU. The Campuses of the Sansthan will follow prescribed hostel rules which will be displayed by respective Campus in their hostels. For hostel management

13. CANCELLATION OF ADMISSITION AND ADMISSION OF WAIT-LISTED CANDIDATES


- 13.1 Admission of the candidates who do not complete the admission-related formalities in time would be cancelled and the wait-listed candidates would be admitted in order of merit,
 - a) In case, a candidate manages to get admission on the basis of information which is later found to be false, his admission would be cancelled without assigning any reason, and the CSU would not be held accountable for the same.
 - b) In case, there is discrepancy between the rules mentioned in this prospectus, and the rules which the Sansthan may have published or indicated in the past from time to time through its notifications, the latter (I.e. the rules published by the CSU) would be applicable, getting preference over the former.

13.2 Admission Fee Refund policy

As per notification of UGC regarding Refunds of Fee and Non-Retention of Orginal Certificates, October, 2018 the following structre may be applicable for refund fees, if a student chooses to withdraw from the programme of the study in which he/she is enrolled.

13.3. Caution Money

- a) In case, a candidate leaves the Sansthan in the middle of the course, without completing it, none of the fees deposited by him, except the Security Amount, shall be refundable to him as per University norms.
- b) Caution money will be paid back after the declaration of result or at the session end. However, if a student takes back the said money during the session, the admission of the student will stand cancelled and he/she will not be re-admitted in any case.

14. DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

14.1Discipline

The conduct of the students must be good and orderly so as to add to the reputation of the CSU. They should not smoke, drink or use other forms of tobacco, or intoxicating drugs. They are expected to take part in the various academic activities being conducted in the campus. In case, any student damages any property of the campus, he may lose his admission and the amount of damage shall be recovered from him.

14.2 Code of Conduct


The students of the Campus shall strictly follow, in totality the code of conduct given below:

- 1. All the students shall practice self-discipline and attend the classes regularly.
- Those who violate the discipline shall be duly punished as per rules. Those held guilty of serious violations may be punished with rustication, if recommended by the Discipline Committee of the Campus.
- 3. Any one damaging campus property shall invite disciplinary action against himself/herself, and shall be held liable to compensate the campus for the losses caused.
- 4. It is expected of the campus students that they shall maintain the dignity of the campus. With this in mind, they are exhorted to stay away from any such undesirable activities which may go against the dignity of the campus.
- The students of the campus should not indulge in politics.

- 6. The discipline committee of the campus may punish the student who spreads, or causes to spread violence, disturbs peace, or tries to force his/her own ideas upon others.
- 7. The decision of the Principal, upon the recommendations of the Discipline Committee, shall be final.
- 8. Use of mobile phones during the classes is banned.

16. EXAMINATION

16.1 General

- (i) a) The Examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester of the three year study programme. Every student admitted in any semester shall be eligible to appear in the concerned examination of the respective semester, subject to the attendance requirement as prescribed by the Bar Council of India and the University which is calculated on the semester basis.
 - b) A candidate for the degree of Bachelor of Laws (Hons.) shall be required to pass in all the prescribed courses in not more than **five years** from the academic session of his admission in the Law Faculty for the first session or as prescribed by the University. Even after that, if a student fails, he/she has to leave the course.
- (ii) Subject to the provisions of the ordinances, the examinations for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws (Hons.) shall be held in Jaipur at such time and on such dates as the Controller of Examination may prescribe.
- (iii) A candidate shall be examined in 6 papers of 100 marks in each semester, each paper carrying 6 credits and one compulsory paper of English Language in the First Semester.
- (iv) Examinations in courses of First Semester to Sixth Semester shall be conducted by means of written papers each of three hours duration, as well as evaluation of Sessional examination/ project works, Regularity, Discussions, Extension Activities, Field Works, Court Visits, and viva voce examination as the case may be.

16.2 Division of Marks:

(1) Each compulsory, optional and honours' paper in the LL.B. (Honours) examination shall consist of 100 marks.

Provided that **70 marks** in each of such paper shall be reserved for award on the basis of written theory paper, 15 marks on the basis of Sessional Examination/project work and 15 marks on the basis of performance including discussion pertaining to the concerned paper, regularity, and alertness in the class.

16.3 Each compulsory Clinical Course in LL.B. Six Semester (Hons.) degree course shall carry the division of marks in the following manner:

(a)Clinical Course Paper – I (Professional Ethics, Accountability of Lawyers and Bar Relationship) in LL.B. (Hons.) First Semester.

(i) Written theory paper -- 60 marks


(ii) Performance including discussion pertaining to the concerned paper, regularity and alertness in class--20 marks

(iii) Viva-Voce - 20 marks

(b) Clinical Course Paper II (Moot Court) in LL.B. (Hons.) Third Semester

(The Moot Court work will be on assigned problems and will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submission and 5 marks for oral advocacy)

- (i) Observance of Trial -- 30 Marks
- (ii) Interviewing Techniques and Pre-Trial Preparation -- 30 Marks (Proceedings of interviewing sessions, recorded in the dairy of the students will carry 15 marks. The other record containing documents and procedures for the Aing of the suit/petition will carry 15 marks)
- (iii) Viva-Voce -- 10 Marks
- (c) Clinical Course Paper III (Drafting, Pleading & Conveyancing) in LL.B.(Hons.) Fourth
 - (i) Exercises in Drafting, Pleading and Conveyancing -- 70 marks

C. Viva-Voce:

- There shall be viva-voce examination of students in LL.B. First and Third Semesters for (i) Clinical Course - I, II and III papers respectively.
 - (ii) The viva voce examination shall be held in Jaipur as such time and on such dates as decided by the Controller of Examinations, in consultation with the Head of VidhiVidhyashakha.

Provided that for the benefit of students who did not complete their training in as provided under the above-mentioned clauses 16.3(a) to (c) at the time of the Semester viva-voce examination or who failed at any prior viva-voce examination, a supplementary viva-voce examination may be held

The viva-voce examination shall be conducted by the Central Sanskrit University and the examiners shall, while evaluating the performance of a candidate, take into account the (iii) diaries etc. maintained by the candidate as the case may be.


16.4 Registration:

- A regular candidate shall apply to the Head of the VidhiShashtraVidyashakha in the prescribed form, together with the prescribed Examination Fee on or before the date that (i) (a) may be appointed in this behalf.
 - An ex-student shall apply to the Registrar in the prescribed form, together with the prescribed Examination Fee, on or before the date that may be appointed in this behalf (b) intimating his intention to appear at the specified examination.
- The Examination Fee shall be such as may be prescribed including Mark Sheet Fee for (ii) (a) each semester examination or any part thereof.

- A candidate who is unable to appear wholly or partly at the relevant examination on (b) any account or who, having appeared, fails to pass the said examination, shall not, except in cases hereafter mentioned, be entitled to a refund of his Examination Fee or adjustment of the fee to the next ensuing examination of the concerned year.
- (c) The Examination Fee paid by a candidate may be refunded if,
 - (i) His/her form has been rejected by the University; or
 - (ii) The fee has been submitted but not the form; or
 - (iii) The Academic Council permits a refund on compassionate grounds.
- (d) Examination Fee of a candidate, after deducting Rs. 10/- may be credited for the next ensuing examination of the concerned year in the case of a candidate who fails to appear at the examination on account of illness.

Provided that an application, supported by a Medical Certificate, shall be made for the aforesaid purpose within a month of the date of commencement of examination.

Provided further that the form which the candidate submits for the next ensuing examination is complete in all respects and is accepted.

- (iv) An Examination Fee once credited to the next ensuing examination shall not be refundable.
- (v) The Registrar / Controller of Examinations shall examine the application which, if found to be in order, shall be registered in the register of candidates for such examination and shall issue Admit Card to the candidate.
- (vi) One Back Paper Examination Fee (including Marks Sheet Fee) shall be as prescribed by the University.

In case, a candidate appears in more than one paper of the back papers he/she will be charged full fees.

16.5 Admit Card:

- No candidate shall be admitted to any examination unless he produces his Admit Card in respect thereof to the Officer conducting the examination or satisfies such Officer that it will (i) be subsequently produced.
- (ii) The Registrar / Controller of Examinations may, if satisfied that an examination Admit Card has been lost or destroyed, issue a duplicate Admit Card on payment of the prescribed fee.

16.6 Examination:

Examination in LL.B. (Hons.) Course of study shall be held semester wise i.e. twice in a year.

16.7 Re-registration for Examination:

- There shall be no supplementary/second examination for LL.B. First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester students. However, students who fail to pass or appear in the paper of LL.B. First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters shall be eligible to appear in the concerned paper or papers of the respective semesters along with the students of next academic session.
- (ii) A student who fails to secure minimum pass marks in any paper/papers of Fifth Semester may appear in the supplementary examination.

(iii) Unless otherwise specifically provided, an ex-candidate shall be required to pass the relevant examination at the time which he actually appears at the examination and not in accordance with the provisions that were prescribed at the time he appeared or should have appeared as a regular candidate, subject to the provisions contained in the Transitory Ordinances.

16.8 Declaration of Division and Distinction:

A candidate who is promoted to a higher class or re-admitted due to shortage of attendance shall be required to study the same syllabus a being taught in that year. But if there is any common paper which has already been studied by him/her in LL.B. First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth or Sixth Semester, he/she may be taught some other paper not studied by him (preferably a paper which is in the new syllabus) with the permission of the HoD.

A candidate who has passed in all the items of LL.B. First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semesters taken all together and obtained the minimum percentage of 45% marks for passing will be declared as "Passed". Such passed candidate will be awarded Division according to the following criteria: योऽनचानः सना महान

16.9 Scale of Marks, Division and Distinction:

Division: First Class: 65% and above of the aggregate of marks in Six Semesters.

Second Class: 45% and above but below 65% of the aggregate of marks in Six

Semesters.

Distinction: A candidate who, without failing in any course, secures an average of

75% or more marks in the aggregate of all the Six Semesters may be

declared to have obtained distinction.

Merit: The order of Merit shall be determined on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the

Six Semesters from among candidates who passed various papers in Six Semesters from the year of their being admitted to the First Semester, subject to the rules/regulations prescribed by the

University in this regard.

16.10 Re-Evaluation of Answer-Books:

A student may apply for reevaluation of answer books in accordance with the notification of the University from time to time.

16.11 Consequences of Irregular Appearance at and passing of Examination:


A student who pursues a course of studies of a higher semester without passing examinations in respect of all the prescribed courses of study for a lower semester shall not be eligible to receive any scholarship, or any other financial aid so long as he has not passed all the relevant examinations which entitles him to be in the semester in which he happens to be.

Provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent the HoD of VidhishstraVidhyashakha from continuing any scholarship or freeship or granting any other financial aid where he is satisfied that a candidate could not appear at the examination because of illness or any other sufficient cause.

Provided further that in granting any scholarship, financial aid including freeship, cases of such students who have not passed in the examination of all the prescribed courses of study of the lower semester, may be considered if adequate number of students who have passed in the examinations of the prescribed courses in the lower semester are not available, on the criteria determined by the Departmental Committee constituted by the HoD for this purpose.

A student shall not be entitled to receive any award, medal, prize or certificate of excellence except in relation to such examination only which he passes as a whole at one time.

17. DEFINITIONS

- "Credit" is the weightage given to a paper in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. Each paper shall consist of 6 credits it means that 6 instructional hours (which shall include Lectures, Tutorials and Project work per week shall be assigned to each paper.
- A "Regular Student" is one who has pursued a regular course of study and obtained prescribed attendance mentioned in the Ordinance and is eligible to appear in the examination for the aforesaid course.
- "Ex-student" is one who has read in the Law School for at least one academic year preceding the date of the annual/semester examination, but has failed or failed to appear in that examination, though otherwise eligible.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS 15.

- 15.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained anywhere, an examination for the benefit of the back-logger of the First and Third Semesters will be held in the month of December and an examination for the benefit of the back-logger of the Second and Fourth Semesters will be held in the month of April on such dates as may be specified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 15.2 The Supplementary Examination for the students of LL.B. Fifth and Sixth Semesters shall be held after the reopening of the University after summer vacation on such dates as may be specified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 15.3 These Ordinances contained herein shall be deemed to have come into effect from the academic session 2024-2025 to the extent of its applicability.
- 15.5 The Head of the Vidhishastra Vidyashakhain consultation with the Departmental Council shall have the power to remove any difficulty in interpretation and /or application of these Ordinances which shall be final.
